
Delivered on the steps at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington D.C. on August 28, 1963

Anne Frank 1929 - 1945

Otto Frank and Edith Frank-Hollander had a daughter on June 12th, 1929 in Frankfurt, Germany. She was called Annelies (Anne). Anne and her older sister, Margot, grew up together in Germany. Due to Hitler's anti-Jewish decrees, her father Otto, made a plan to open a branch of his business in Amsterdam, Holland, to allow his family to join him later there. In 1933 when they moved to southern Amsterdam, Anne started attending school there where she excelled.

Anne always kept close to her sister during their childhood. When Anne turned 13 years old, her parents gave her a diary as a present and she started writing about her experiences and feelings at that time. Years later the Netherlands (Holland), was deeply affected by the Nazis' invasion. The Frank family had to move and they were hiding in the attic above a store next to Otto's previous office.

During the two years of hiding in the attic, Anne confided completely in her diary "Kitty", as she referred to it. She felt that on her diary she was able to express her deepest feelings and experiencesduring the war. She was an exceptionally sensitive young teenager. Her diary was found after she left it behind, with some other personal belongings, in the attic when the family was deported to a concentration camp in Germany. Due to cold, disease adverse circumstances and starvation, Margot, her sister, developed typhus and later on she died. Anne was deeply affected by her loss and shortly after contracted the disease and died of it in 1945. She was only fifteen years old when she died. The concentration camp was liberated by the British just a few weeks after. Her diary is considered to be one of the most read books since its release.


A festival celebrated in Sri
