Days of Observance & Cultural Significance : August 1, 2013-August 31, 2014

List is **not all inclusive**. Please heed following dates when planning academic calendars and school events, and accommodate accordingly. Please ask parents/guardians and employees to submit any other faith dates requiring accommodation as soon as possible to the school or work-site supervisor. Inform Human Rights, Equity & Inclusive Education Advisor if an important date is missing.

Faith and non-faith accommodation is an integral part of the Board's Human Rights Education AP 214 as per...

- Canadian Charter of Rights & Freedoms (Section 15); Ontario Human Rights Code; Education Act
- Equity & Inclusive Education in Ontario Schools: Faith Accommodation PPM108; R.R.O 1990, Regulation 298; PPM 119 (Ministry of Education)

Dates ...

- reflect a cross-section of faith, non-faith and ethno-cultural communities in the Board and Kingston
- may vary from community to community, within faith groups & families, as do breadth & depth of observance
- may vary from year to year, based on type of calendar (Gregorian, Julian, lunar, solar, astronomical), local customs, or may even be determined by community convenience

Other areas to consider include...

- holy days and religious festivals in Bahà'i, Muslim and Jewish communities begin at sundown the previous day & end sunset on date listed, e.g. Rosh Hashanah begins Sept 4th at sundown & ends at sunset Sept 6th
- Jewish Sabbath begins at sundown the previous day & ends at sunset on the Sabbath day

Spiritual and cultural dates observed by *First Nations, Métis or Inuit* peoples also vary in time, practice, in length or breadth, and are determined by the community and geography. For example, length of Longhouse ceremonies depend on individuals and their community. Ceremonies may last from 4 to 10 days. First Nations, Métis and Inuit peoples' dates may include...

- ceremonies and seasonal traditional celebrations
- full moon and feast dates, e.g. Fish Feast in April, Strawberry Moon Festival in June, Harvest Festival or Moose Calling Moon in the fall, Mid-Winter Festival January/February
- time variations depending on individual and community practices, and geography
